## Module 0 How to Use this Course



This course is for those who want to learn to use the Word 121 Bible reading tool online at a time that is convenient for them. You can ask questions from our tutors at any time at course-support@citybibleforum.org . We highly recommend that you sign up for one of our free Monthly real time training sessions with our friendly trainers: training.theword121.com.au.

These sessions will allow you to ask questions and join a community of Bible sharers. You can also view a <u>recorded session</u> to see what those are like before you attend.



This online course includes 3 Modules. Each module contains short video Workshops, Bible verses, Reflection questions, Real stories, quizzes and a prayer. Each module should only take you around 20 mins from start to finish, although you will get more out of the materials if you take more time to reflect and pray. We recommend that you start thinking about and praying for someone who you would like to share the Bible with.



This course is designed to get you started being a Bible Sharer, using a tool called the Word 121. The Word 121 walks you and a friend through the Gospel of John and helps you share the Bible with ease, confidence and friendship.

This course will answer three key questions:

Why should I share the Bible? How do I use the Word 121 tool? And How do I ask people to read the Bible with me?

## Module 1 Sharing: Why be a Bible Sharer?



Have you ever talked to your friends about your relationship with God? Have you ever opened the Bible with a friend? Did you know that 1 in 5 people will read the Bible with someone if asked? If those odds give you confidence, then this module will convict you that reading the Bible with a friend is a great way to share your faith which hopefully leads your friend to seek God. Read the Bible passage and watch the video to get a feel for why sharing the Bible with someone can be both important and natural.



#### John 4:7-26

When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans).

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

"Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back."

"I have no husband," she replied.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."


"Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."
"Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You Samaritans worship what you do not know;



we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he."

### **Question 1**

Why are Australian attitudes to the Bible confusing?

#### **Correct Answer: B**

The quote from Steve McAlpine's says that:

"People have never been more hostile to the Bible, but at the same time they have never been more open".

This is consistent with McCrindle's recent findings about Spirituality in their survey.

This is seen in the rising proportion of Australians identifying with no-religion, growing from 19% in 2006 to 30% in 2016... During the pandemic almost half of Australians have thought more about the meaning of life (47%) or their own mortality (47%). A third of Australians have thought more about God (33%), while three in ten (28%) have prayed more.

#### **Question 2**

Pray for God to grow you in confidence to share the Bible with your friend. Pray for that one friend you thought of earlier. Pray that God will open doors for you to talk about spiritual things. Pray that you will get to know your friend better. Pray that God will enrich your friendship so that they can not only know you care, but know of God's care for them through you.



## Module 2 Doing - Using The Word 121



Now that you have started to pray for a friend you want to share the Bible with, it's time to become familiar with The Word 121 tool. The Word 121 is designed to make opening the Bible with a friend as easy and enjoyable as possible. This allows you to focus on your friend, but what is it and how does it work?

# Module 3 Asking - Finding someone to read with



This module shows you how to "ask" someone to read the Bible with you. We know how to ask someone to share a coffee with us, or share a movie or a meal, but how do we share the Word of God with a friend? It can seem really daunting, but we also know that it's not just important to us, but could be life-changing for our friends.



### John 4: 27-38

Just then his disciples returned and were surprised to find him talking with a woman. But no one asked, "What do you want?" or "Why are you talking with her?"

Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town and said to the people, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" They came out of the town and made their way toward him. Meanwhile his disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat something." But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you know nothing about." Then his disciples said to each other, "Could someone have brought him food?" "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. 36 Even now the one who reaps draws a wage and harvests a crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true. I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labour."
